Common Critical Care Nursing Questions and Answers

Assessment and Monitoring

1. What are the primary components of a rapid bedside assessment in the ICU?

Vital signs (HR, BP, RR, SpO₂, temperature)

2. Level of consciousness (GCS or AVPU)
3. Airway patency and ventilation status
4. Circulatory status (capillary refill, skin color, edema)
5. Neurologic status (pupil size, focal deficits)

- It may indicate inadequate oxygen delivery due to hypovolemia, anemia, or low cardiac output.
- Immediate actions: reassess volume status, consider fluid bolus, review inotropes, and evaluate hemoglobin levels.

- The Sequential Organ Failure Assessment (SOFA) score combined with lactate monitoring.

Pharmacology and Medication Management

1. Explain the mechanism of action for norepinephrine and its primary clinical use.

Norepinephrine is a potent alpha adrenergic agonist with some beta adrenergic activity, causing vasoconstriction and increasing systemic vascular resistance.

2. It is the first line vasopressor for septic shock to restore mean arterial pressure.

- Monitor for arrhythmias, especially tachycardia.
- Adjust dose to avoid exacerbating renal hypoperfusion.
- Consider switching to norepinephrine if renal function does not improve.
- Check catheter patency and line flow rates.
- Assess ultrafiltration rate—reduce or pause if needed.
- Review fluid balance and adjust dialysate composition.

Ventilatory Support

1. What are the indications for initiating mechanical ventilation?

Inadequate oxygenation (PaO₂ < 50 mmHg)

2. Respiratory muscle fatigue or failure
3. Altered mental status impairing protective airway reflexes
4. Severe chest wall or airway obstruction

- Pressure control delivers a set inspiratory pressure, allowing tidal volume to vary with lung compliance.
- Volume control delivers a set tidal volume, allowing inspiratory pressure to vary.
- Elevate the head of the bed to 30–45°.
- Perform regular oral care with chlorhexidine.
- Use subglottic secretion drainage when available.
- Implement daily sedation vacations and spontaneous breathing trials.

Infection Prevention and Control

1. Which hand hygiene technique is most effective for preventing ICU infections?

The WHO 5 step hand rub method using alcohol based hand sanitizer for at least 20 seconds.

- Immediately upon suspicion of VAP, especially if the patient has risk factors such as prolonged ventilation, immunosuppression, or recent antibiotic use.
- Reduces the risk of contamination and maintains negative pressure, thereby minimizing aerosol spread.
- Preserves the integrity of the ventilatory circuit and prevents disconnection events.

Patient Comfort and Pain Management

1. What is the most appropriate approach to manage agitation in a mechanically ventilated patient?

Assess for underlying causes: pain, delirium, hypoxia, or medication side effects.

2. Use sedation scales (RASS, CAM ICU) and titrate sedatives accordingly.

3. Consider non pharmacologic interventions—positioning, noise reduction, and family presence.

- Use behavioral pain scales such as the Behavioral Pain Scale (BPS) or Critical-Care Pain Observation Tool (CPOT).

- Monitor physiological indicators: heart rate, blood pressure, and respiratory rate.

- A multimodal approach: opioid for baseline pain, NSAIDs if not contraindicated, and regional blocks when feasible.

- Regular reassessment every 4–6 hours using validated pain scales.

Family Communication and Ethical Considerations

1. What are the key elements of effective family meetings in the ICU?

Clear, compassionate communication of the patient's status and prognosis.

2. Active listening and addressing family concerns.

3. Providing decision making support and involving interdisciplinary input.

- Revisit the advanced directive documentation.

- Facilitate a meeting with the healthcare team to clarify the patient's values and preferences.

- Document all discussions and decisions meticulously.
