

rca universal remote programming guide

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Introduction

- Soundbar (Bose) – 000016, 000017, 000018
- Streaming Device (Roku) – 000019, 000020, 000021

Troubleshooting Common Issues

Code Not Working

Check the following:

1. Verify the code matches your device's brand and model.
2. Ensure the remote's batteries are fully charged.
3. Confirm the device's IR sensor is unobstructed.

Remote Won't Enter Programming Mode

Try holding the **Power** button for 10 seconds. If the LED still does not flash, replace the batteries or reset the remote by removing the battery pack and reassembling it after a minute.

Device Responds but Functions Fail

Some remotes require a secondary "search" mode. Press and hold the **Program** button while scanning through the code list until the device responds. Once found, save the code again.

Advanced Features: Macros, Timers, and Voice Control

Many RCA remotes support advanced programming beyond simple device control.

- **Macro Programming** – Create a single button that powers on the TV, switches to HDMI 1, and sets the volume to a preset level.
- **Timer Function** – Schedule your TV to turn off at 10 /PM every night.
- **Voice Control** – Pair the remote with your smartphone or smart speaker for voice commands.
