Safety First: Before You Begin

Never attempt to disassemble a firearm that is not unloaded. Follow these safety steps to protect yourself and your equipment.

1. Check the Chamber – Ensure the pistol is unloaded. Remove the magazine and inspect the chamber with a

flashlight.

2. Clear the Magazine Well – Pull the slide back and verify no rounds remain in the magazine well.
3. Use a Clean Work Surface – Place the pistol on a stable, non-metallic surface to avoid accidental discharge.
4. Wear Protective Gear – Safety glasses and gloves are recommended.
5. Keep a Clean Work Area – Have cleaning supplies and parts organized beforehand.

Tools You'll Need

While the Ruger P89 does not require specialized tools, having the right equipment on hand speeds up the process and reduces the risk of damage.

- Flat head screwdriver (small)
- Hex key set (1 /mm to 2 /mm)
- Cleaning rods or bore brushes
- Gun oil or light machine oil
- Compressed air or a cleaning brush for the slide rails
- Magazine for reloading after cleaning

Step by Step Disassembly Guide

1. Remove the Magazine

With the pistol unloaded, press the magazine release button and pull the magazine out. Set it aside in a safe place.

2. Separate the Slide from the Frame

Open the pistol by pulling the slide back. Using a flat head screwdriver, gently pry the slide away from the frame's slide rails. The slide will slide forward as you release it.

3. Detach the Recoil Spring Assembly

Locate the recoil spring guide rod on the slide. Using a 1 mm hex key, remove the small pin that secures the spring. Slide the recoil spring and guide rod out of the frame. Keep the spring in a clean, dry container to avoid losing it.

4. Separate the Trigger Group

On the left side of the slide, you'll find the trigger guard. Remove the trigger guard by gently prying it off with a flat head screwdriver. This exposes the trigger, hammer, and sear.

5. Remove the Trigger and Hammer

Use a 1 mm hex key to loosen the pin that holds the trigger to the slide. Once loosened, lift the trigger out of its slot. The hammer can be removed by pulling it upward; a small thumb or a 1 mm hex key will help release the hammer pin.

6. Take Out the Barrel

With the slide and trigger group removed, the barrel is exposed. Use a 1 mm hex key to unscrew the barrel from the slide. Hold the barrel with a clean cloth to prevent scratching the surface.

7. Inspect the Slide Rails

Check the slide rails for dirt or damage. Use compressed air or a cleaning brush to clear any debris. Inspect the rails for scratches or wear that could affect slide movement.

Cleaning Your Ruger P89

Once disassembled, cleaning is straightforward. Follow these steps to keep each component in peak condition.

Barrel Cleaning

1. Insert a bore brush into the barrel and run it from the chamber to the muzzle.
2. Apply a small amount of cleaning solvent and wipe with a clean rag.
3. Repeat until the rag comes out clean.
4. Dry the barrel with a lint free cloth.

Slide and Frame Cleaning

1. Wipe the slide and frame with a solvent soaked rag.
2. Use a small brush to clean the recoil spring guide rod and slide rails.
3. Dry all parts thoroughly before reassembly.

Trigger Group Maintenance

1. Apply a light coat of oil to the trigger, hammer, and sear to ensure smooth operation.
2. Check for any worn pins or components; replace if necessary.
3. Reassemble with care to avoid misalignment.

Reassembly: Putting It All Back Together

1. Reattach the Barrel

Insert the barrel back into the slide and tighten the barrel nut with a 1 mm hex key. Ensure the barrel is seated correctly and the threaded muzzle is secure.

2. Reinstall the Slide

Slide the slide back onto the frame rails. Align the slide properly and release it to lock into position.

3. Reinstall the Recoil Spring Assembly

Place the recoil spring and guide rod back into the frame. Insert the pin that secures the spring and tighten with the hex key.

4. Reattach the Trigger Group

Insert the trigger back into its slot and secure it with the pin. Reattach the hammer, ensuring it sits flush with the slide. Replace the trigger guard.

5. Final Checks

1. Verify the slide moves freely without obstruction.
2. Check the trigger pull and ensure the manual safety engages correctly.
3. Load a practice round into a magazine and test the pistol in a safe environment.

Troubleshooting Common Issues
